Upper Common Telephone Kiosk

Effort is being made to ensure safety standards are met regarding electrical wiring at the site. Funding for the restoration of the kiosk has been secured.

Lydney Cycle Link

The GCC propose an interconnected link for cyclists throughout Lydney to facilitate improved communications and accessibility for the public. Cllrs Harrison and Blamey held a site meeting with Cllr Prest and a Highways representative to discuss issues arising for Aylburton and pointed out several problem areas where safety might be a factor.

Cross Monument

Historic England have signified their approval for the restoration of the *base* of the Cross but importantly not for the *replacement* of the Cross as this runs counter to their policy regarding the preservation of the historical timeline. Cllr Harrison will be pressing HE to review their decision.

Aylburton Housing Needs Survey

Forest of Dean District Council has created a new strategic programme for undertaking housing needs surveys, which GRCC (Gloucestershire Rural Community Council) has been appointed to carry out.

A number of parishes were identified within phase 1, including Aylburton Parish.

Since 1923 GRCC has provided Gloucestershire's communities with expert advice and guidance in respect of the current issues, affordable housing included. GRCC is undertaking this survey as an independent and neutral organisation.

Every household in Aylburton Parish will receive a paper survey questionnaire, hand-delivered alongside the next edition of the Ducktown Echo in early July. Everyone is encouraged to complete and return the questionnaire in the pre-paid envelope provided. Information received in response to the survey about Aylburton housing needs may be used to influence future development.

The survey questionnaire does not ask for people's names and contact details. The outcome report will be published later this year with anonymous statistics and information, and it will be made available on Aylburton Parish Council website.

Carnival Day & Dog Show Saturday 13th July

In December, Aylburton WI will be celebrating their Centenary. This is an outstanding achievement, as only three institutes in the Gloucester Federation have already celebrated their 100 years.

The first committee meeting was held at Kingston House in Aylburton on 8th December 1919. Here it was decided to call the institute the 'Aylburton Institute'. The General meetings would be held on the first Wednesday of every month at 6:30pm in Aylburton School. The first elected President was Lady Bertha Bledisloe, Vice President Mrs S Way, Miss Martie Parker as Secretary, and Miss Ada Gillham, the school teacher, took on the role of treasurer.

The first meeting was advertised for young ladies married or single and over 21 years of age. It is understood several underaged young women gatecrashed the first meeting as it was such a novelty to have a *women only* event. The first book club was formed, with books being loaned free to members. At meetings each member contributed 1d towards the cleaning of the School which was used as WI headquarters.

Moving on to the 1920s, the Memorial Hall was built and the WI have met here ever since, although now we meet on the second Tuesday of every month at 7:30pm. Through valiant efforts a piano was presented to the Hall for village organisations to use.

As war broke out in 1939, the WI set about making copious amounts of jam and preserves and sent them to the Red Cross and other charities. Members joined the Linen Guild and helped in billeting evacuees and nursing.

In 1953 a seat was purchased by the WI to celebrate the Coronation and was positioned on Milling Green. Television was a novelty during this era, so a large screen was installed in the School for the villagers to follow the Coronation service.

At the beginning of 1957, 14 members wrote a book 'The History of Aylburton' but found the cost of printing too expensive, so this was put on hold until 1985 when the late Mrs June Legge, Mrs Bayliss and Mrs E Wolridge approached Whitecross School to ask for help. The book was duly printed and in a short time 250 copies were sold at £1.50 each. Thanks to these ladies we still have a copy of this today.

This is only a brief look at the beginning of Aylburton WI. There are many long standing members with some attending for over 40 years. At present our longest-attending member is Kathleen Harris, who has held

President and Secretary positions in the WI.

More recently the WI has flourished and helped to support many charities, including Great Oaks Hospice, Lydney Hospital, the Salvation Army and Forest Food Bank.

The buildings date back to 1869 and the school was officially opened in 1870 on land donated by the Bathurst Family. We are interested in hearing your family memories in connection with the school and seeing any photographs from years gone by. Everyone will be welcome to visit a display in the village on the day of the carnival.

Mrs Pam Bendall is retiring after 29 years working as the School Administrator during which time she has seen many changes both of staff and children. We thank her for all that she has done for the school over all these years and wish her well in her retirement.

Class 3 visited the STEAM museum, Swindon in January. They had a great trip and all went dressed as evacuees but were pleased to return home at the end of the day. Members of the school choir joined together with Lydney C of E Choir and represented the Severn Federation at the Young Voices concert at the NEC in January. They had a brilliant time once again.

A Team was entered for the netball tournament held at Dean Academy in March and did very well. A team also

entered the recent Quiksticks hockey tournament in March and were third equal in their group with Lydney C of E School which is not bad for such a small school.

On World Book Day in March all children came to school dressed as a character from their favourite book. Another celebration was Red Nose Day when everyone wore something red or spotty. £100 was raised from donations and a raffle.

The whole school has just taken part in a 'Healthy Me Week'. This covered a range of topics including being active through exercise, balanced diets, mental wellbeing and the school nursing team held workshops on dental hygiene.

Class 1 have visited Blaise Castle, near Bristol as part of their topic on castles. Class 2 went on a trip to St. Fagans in April where they took part in an Iron Age workshop as well as looking around the museum.

Term ends at 3:15pm on Friday 5th April with the annual Easter Service at 9:15 followed by coffee and hot cross buns in school and a chance to say farewell to Mrs Bendall.
