A Neighbourhood Development Plan

Kate Baugh (GRCC) will be attending a planned meeting on 11th February and will be present at the full Council meeting on that day. Further consideration will be given to this next year. There may be a financial benefit to the village if such a plan was formulated but various factors need to be taken into account.

Planning

Several applications were considered. With regard to applications for the removal of trees, the council in general favours the preservation of healthy specimens for environmental and character-retaining aspects, but it is sympathetic in cases where trees and/or branches present a hazard and need to be removed.

Grass Cutting

Thanks were given to Cllr. Mark Topping for presenting a proposed programme of verge management that would enhance the habitat and promote pollinating insects. The timetable for implementation will be for future discussion, but likely no sooner than 2022.

Bus Shelter Repair (Sandford Road)

This has been inspected again and clearly some work is needed. Three quotations for the work will be needed for a proper procurement processes.

Flooding

Pressure will be maintained on Two Rivers Housing to make sure Milling Brook is regularly and comprehensively cleared of weeds.

Conservation Area

Mark Topping and John Harrison will study the Conservation Area guidelines and will also seek to identify any serious existing concerns. Any useful information could be circulated to residents through the Ducktown Echo.

Gravestone Safety Standards

A rota will be established to ensure the stability of tombstones in the churchyard.

Housing Needs Survey

Consideration of this will be postponed, pending a forthcoming visit by GRCC and possibly Savills Estate Management.

The Cross Monument

No response regarding an interpretive plaque has been received yet from Historic England.

An Interview with the new Vicar, David Gardiner August 2019

Introducing the new Vicar, David Gardiner

The Revd David Gardiner, who is currently Chaplain to the Bishop of Gloucester, the Rt Revd Rachel Treweek, will take on the role of Vicar of the United Benefice of Lydney, Woolaston with Alvington and Aylburton. He'll be starting his ministry at the end of November, as the Advent season begins and is looking forward to his first Christmas in Lydney.

David is 38 and married to Sarah. His soft Scottish accent betrays his northern roots, but with family in Tutshill, he feels a strong connection to the Forest area.

The Diocese asked him some questions to help you get to know him better before he takes up his new role.

How do you feel about your new appointment?

"I think surprise is a good word to describe it. We hadn't expected to be called on to something new at quite this time, but as so often happens with God, it's come in a way that makes a lot of sense when you're looking back at it, even if it was unexpected at the time. Bishop Rachel and I had agreed from the start that we were aiming for 3-5 years for my time as chaplain, and at the start of this year had said it would be good to keep our eyes open.

Lydney was somewhere that I was already connected to as the church where I was confirmed by Bishop David Bentley. When I went there with Bishop Rachel we noted how good it felt to be there, and I think even said it was a pity it had come up for interview before too soon in my time in Gloucester. It's energising to be going into something fresh and new, and to a place that has such a wealth of possibility as Lydney, Woolaston, Alvington and Aylburton."

The whole benefice has quite a vibrant energy to it. The villages have made the important decision to worship together as one church, using each of their four distinct church buildings in turn for Sunday worship. Loyal. Listener. Creative

Sarah and I already feel very warmly welcomed in the benefice. We were delighted to meet those we had a chance to chat to at the licensing service on Sunday 24th November, and look forward to getting to know everyone as we live and worship alongside them over the coming years.

Dr Charles Scott-Garrett's fossils

Dr Charles Scott-Garrett lived at Aylburton from 1930 until the 1960s. His main interest was the history and archaeology of the Forest of Dean. The book *Archaeology in Dean* by Cyril Hart is a tribute to his work.

He was also interested in geology and made several unusual finds. These included a fossil ichthyosaur (a carnivorous sea-living reptile) at Awre and the fossilised tracks of an ancient amphibian, called a labyrinthodont, in rock at Tump Hill, Aylburton.

I am trying to find out where these specimens are now. It is possible that Dr Scott-Garrett gave them to local friends before moving to Ross on Wye, where he spent his later years.

I would be grateful for any information.
